From the Pastor...

Happy New Year! I hope this letter finds you well and still joyous from the celebration of Christmas. I pray that you will be blessed throughout the New Year.

I am pleased to announce that Father Henry Shelton, former priest of St. James Catholic Church, will lead us in a study of the Gospel according to Mark beginning Wednesday evening, January 7 at 6:15 pm in the Sanctuary.

Father Henry was born in 1942 in Woodville, MS and graduated high school in 1960. He entered college seminary at St. Joseph's Seminary in Covington, LA, where in 1964 he earned a B.A. in Liberal Arts with a major in Church History and a minor in philosophy. He completed four years of graduate study in theology at Notre Dame Seminary in New Orleans, LA in 1969. Henry was ordained into the priesthood in March 1969. He served as Priest in the Diocese of Jackson until his retirement in February 2008. Father Henry currently lives in Saltillo and is a motorcycle enthusiast.

The study of Mark will be a bit different than many of you are accustomed. Each participant will be asked to approach this journey through Mark as though it were their first encounter with the person Jesus (easier said than done). The study will continue for seven weeks and end on February 18.

Rather than ignoring or making fun of those who look or act differently, eliminate the distractions by making use of the light given to us in the birth of our savior to help us see others and ourselves as people of worth. Through Christ, we are the adopted children of God.

Library Lines

The Helen Allen Library is pleased to have received a copy of the program and the proceedings of A Ceremony for the Unveiling of the Portrait of Judge Glen H. Davidson, Senior United States District Judge. The ceremony took place in Aberdeen, Mississippi, on Monday, April 14, 2008. The material was presented to the library by Tom Groome, who led the invocation. It is an honor to worship with Glen at First Presbyterian. In his invocation Tom praised God for His gifts to Glen: "his wisdom and understanding... the way he administers the law impartially, and... his judgment to declare what is just and right." Please come by the library and see a copy of the portrait, the program, and a copy of the proceedings of this important event in Glen's distinguished service.

There is a wonderful book entitled *Holy Land Journey* in the library. This book is mostly a book of photographs – photographs of the Holy Land. It is an attempt to "capture the essence of the Holy Land." For many who have not traveled there and even for many who have, this book contains wonderful pictures of the Jordan River, the Dead Sea, the Sea of Galilee, the wadi where David hid from Saul in I Samuel 24, the Kidron Valley, and many churches and present day sites. It is a beautiful, fascinating book!

The library subscribes to Presbyterian magazines with some wonderful articles. A recent copy of *Horizons* had a fascinating article entitled "Presbyterian Women: A Part of Immigration History." The October 27, 2008, copy of the *Presbyterian Outlook* contains a 2009 outlook guide to PC (USA)-related colleges. It also contains an article on advent entitled "Waiting." The writer begins by a fairly accurate description of most of us: "The Psalmist says, wait for the Lord. I have a hard time waiting for my toast to pop up." When you have a minute – if that ever happens – drop by and glance through some magazines.

Aubre Wells has – in answer to a specific, repeated request – contributed the following entry for Library Lines. Thank you, Aubre! Let's see, there are Jack and four little ones; you must have wonderful time management skills. Thanks for so unselfishly including L.L. in your busy schedule.

For one's New Year's reading (we won't call it a resolution!), two authors have a simple yet profound message to share with the Christian community. Their message? Prayer takes practice. We assume that we should just know how to pray or that there is a certain formula for prayer. We assume that if we do not do it at a certain time in a certain manner for a certain length of time, that it doesn't count. And, oh, forgive us should our minds wander while we are at the business of prayer! "Not so!" says Brother Lawrence and Richard Foster. Brother Lawrence, a seventeenth century French Carmelite, is perhaps the world's most famous dishwasher. For him "This time of business (in the kitchen) does not with me differ from the time of prayer, and in the noise and clatter of my kitchen... I possess God in as great tranquility as if I were upon my knees at the Blessed Sacrament."

Consider this from *The Practice of the Presence of God*: "(God) is always near you and with you; leave Him not alone. You would think it rude to leave a friend alone who came to visit you; why then must God be neglected? Do not then forget Him, but think on Him often, adore Him continually, live and abide with Him; this is the glorious employment of a Christian." From Richard Foster's Prayer: "The question is not whether we fail again and again – that is a given; the question is whether over a period of time we are developing a practiced habit of divine fellowship. God waits for us in the inner sanctuary of the soul. He welcomes us there, where we can experience, in the word of M. Guyon, a 'continuous inner abiding.' And here is the joy: the results are always in excess of the work put in."

From Our Kitchen to Yours:

Asparagus, Ham, and Fontina Bread Pudding

- 1 pound asparagus
- 1 teaspoon olive oil
- 1 cup chopped onion
- Cooking spray
- 5 (1.4-ounce) slices firm white sandwich bread cut into 1/2-inch cubes
- 1/2 cup chopped ham
- 3/4 cup (3 ounces) shredded fontina cheese
- 1 2/3 cups milk
- 3 eggs
- 2 teaspoons Dijon mustard
- 1/2 teaspoon dried basil
- 1/4 teaspoon each salt and pepper

Preheat oven to 375°.

Cut a 3-inch tip from each asparagus spear, reserving the stalks for another use. Cut asparagus tips into 1/2-inch pieces. Heat oil in a nonstick skillet over medium-high heat. Add onion; saute for 5 minutes or until tender, stirring frequently. Add asparagus; cover and cook 4 minutes, stirring once. Remove from heat, and set aside. Coat 6 (10-ounce) custard cups or ramekins with cooking spray; place in a large baking pan. Place bread cubes evenly in custard cups. Top evenly with asparagus mixture, ham, and cheese. Combine milk and remaining ingredients, stirring with a whisk. Pour evenly into custard cups; let stand 20 minutes. Add hot water to pan to a depth of 1 inch. Cover and bake at 375° for 30 minutes. Uncover and bake an additional 15 minutes. Let stand 10 minutes before serving.
